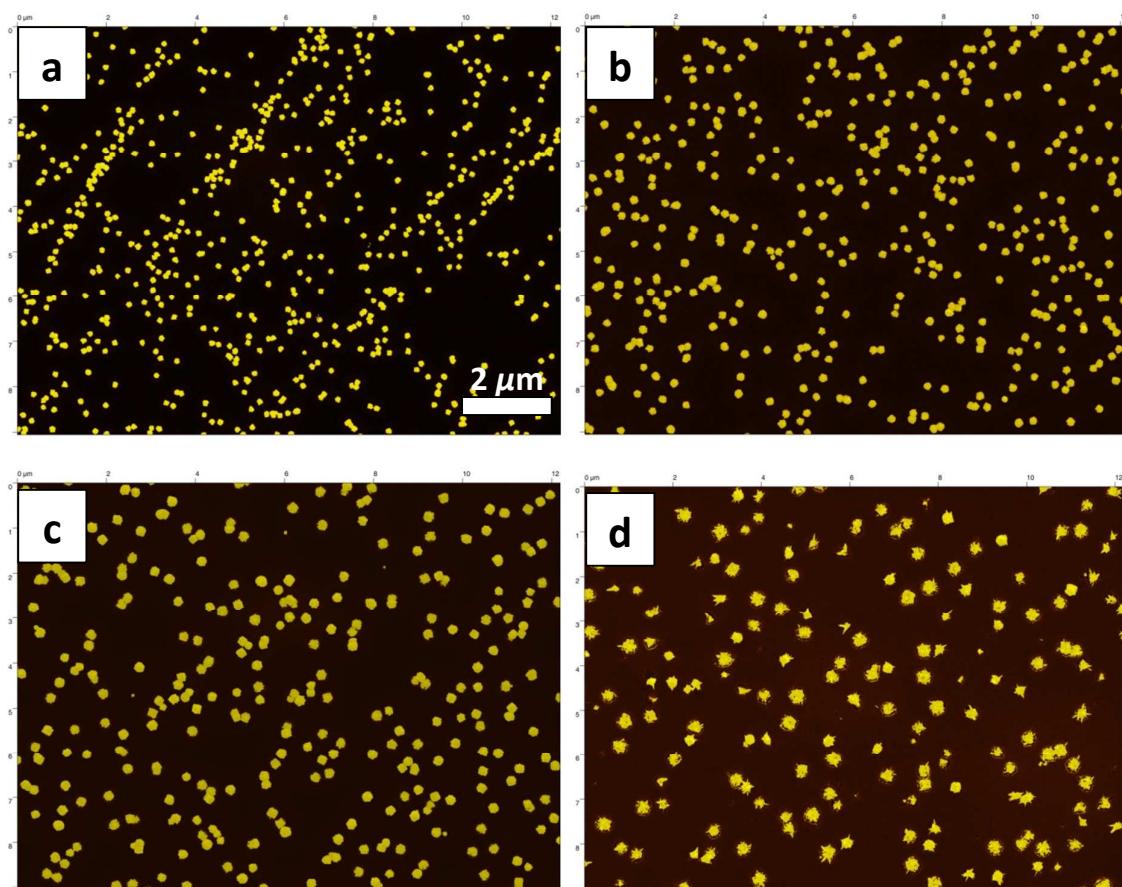

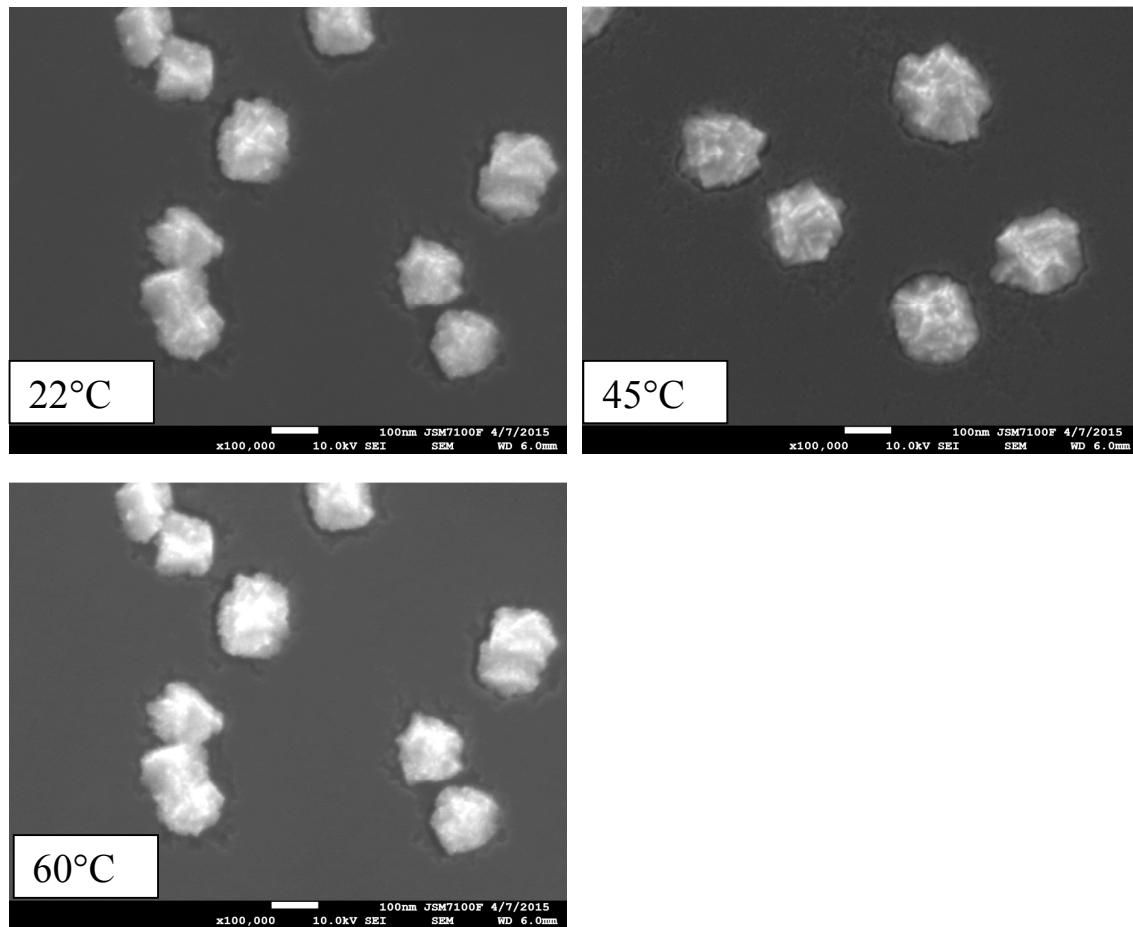


Figure S2. High-magnification SEM images of flat H-Si(100) surfaces after electroless deposition of Pt at 22, 45 and 60°C for 5 min. Deposition solution: Na₂PtCl₄ at 1 mM in HF 4.6 M. These images show the Pt NCs growing in the trenches of silicon bulk.

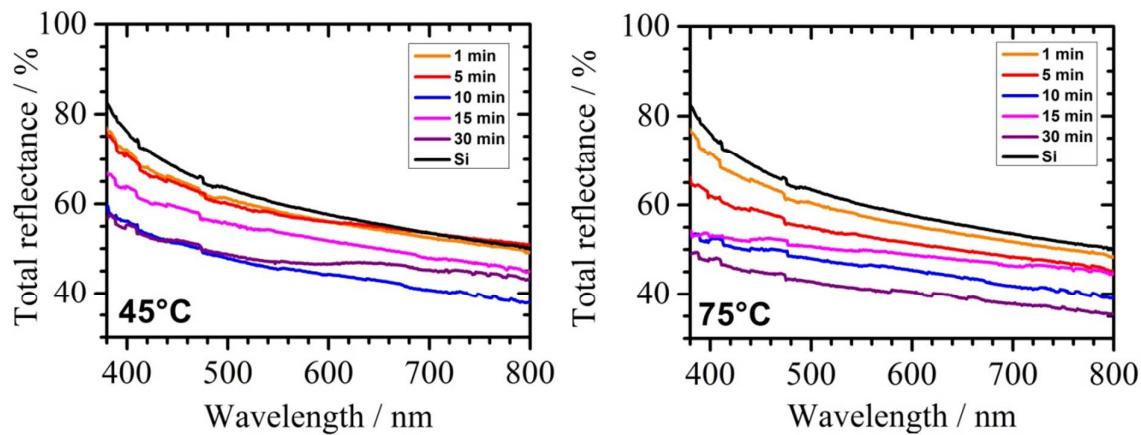


Figure S3. Total reflectance spectra of Pt-coated photoelectrodes prepared at 45 and 75°C for different times (colour lines) and H-Si (black line).
