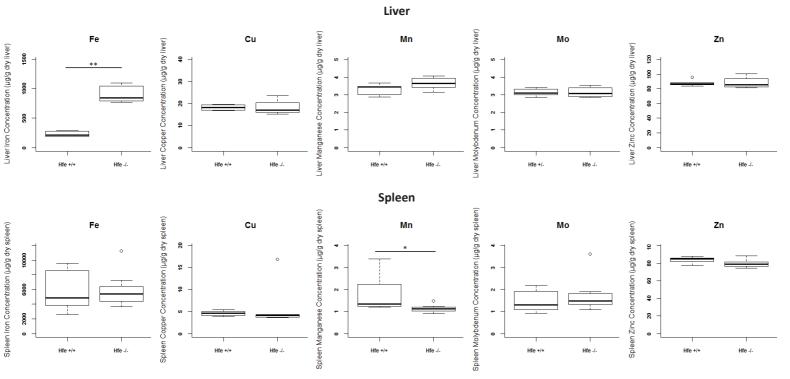

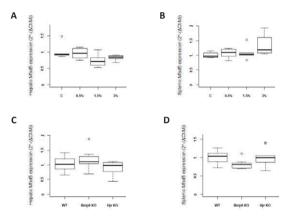
Supplemental data S2. Hfe<sup>+/+</sup> and Hfe<sup>-/-</sup> mice: iron (Fe), copper (Cu), manganese (Mn), molybdenum (Mo) and zinc (Zn) concentrations in the liver (upper panel) and spleen (lower nanel).

The median is represented by a horizontal line within the boxes, the 25th and 75th percentiles are represented by the lower and upper lines of boxes, respectively, and the 10th and 90th percentiles are represented by horizontal lines located on either side of boxes. Statistically significant differences are presented as \*p<0.05 and \*\*p<0.01.

## Supplemental data S4. Hepatic and splenic Mfsd5 expression in experimental models.

Hepatic (A) and splenic (B) Mfsd5 expression in carbonyl iron overloaded mice receiving iron added to a normal diet at different concentrations: 0.5% (n=6), 1.5% (n=6), 3% (n=6) and control mice (C; n=5). Hepatic (C) and splenic (D) Mfsd5 expression in Bmp6 KO mice (n=10), Hjv KO mice (n=10) and control mice (WT; n=10). Values of gene expression are expressed relatively to the control group's mean value (M):  $2^{\circ}$ -(DCt-M). M corresponds to the delta Ct mean in the control group. The median is represented by a horizontal line within the boxes, the 25th and 75th percentiles are represented by the lower and upper lines of boxes, respectively, and the 10th and 90th percentiles are represented by horizontal lines located on either side of boxes.
