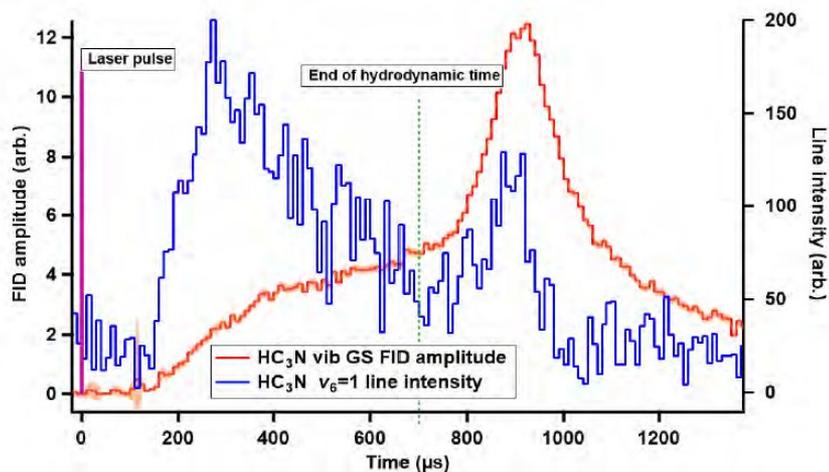
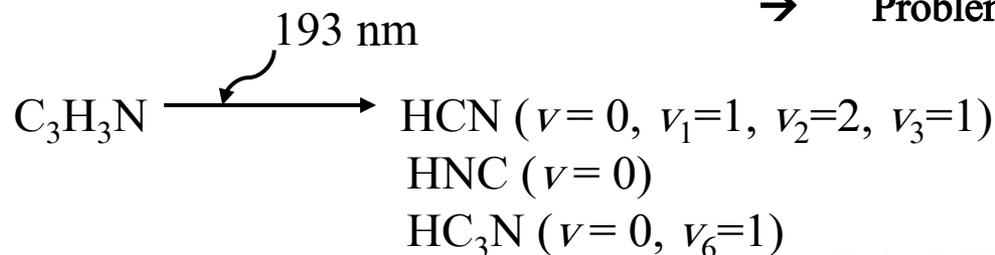

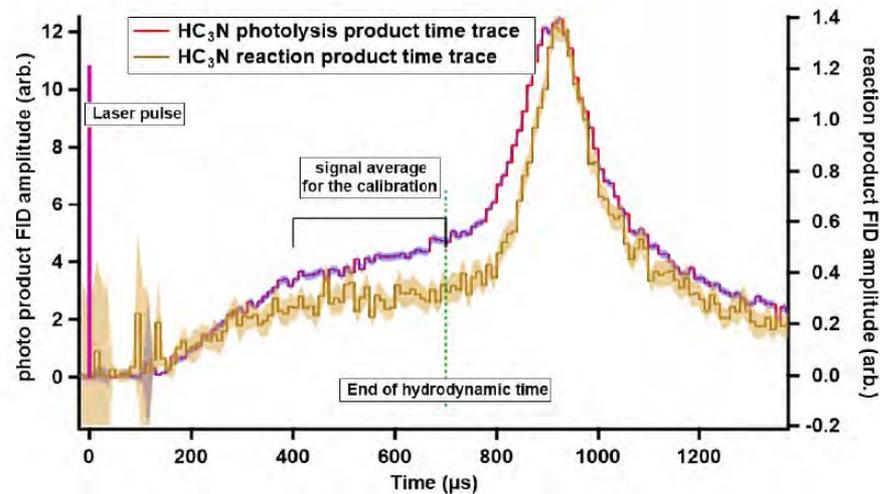

→ Problem in reaction product branching studies

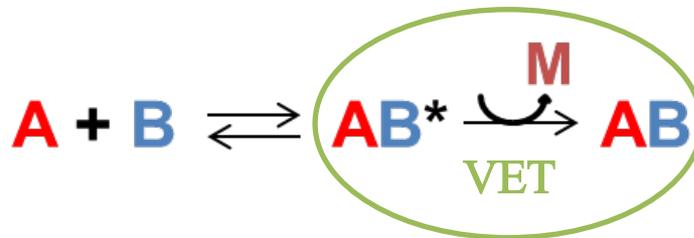


Incomplete vibrational relaxation



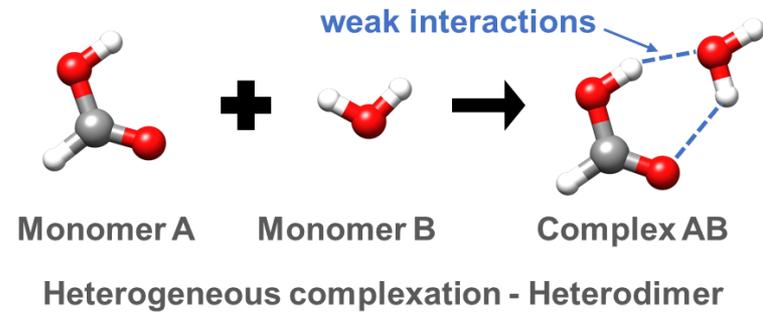
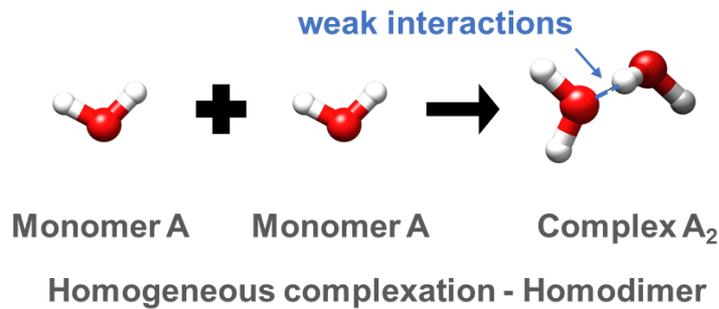

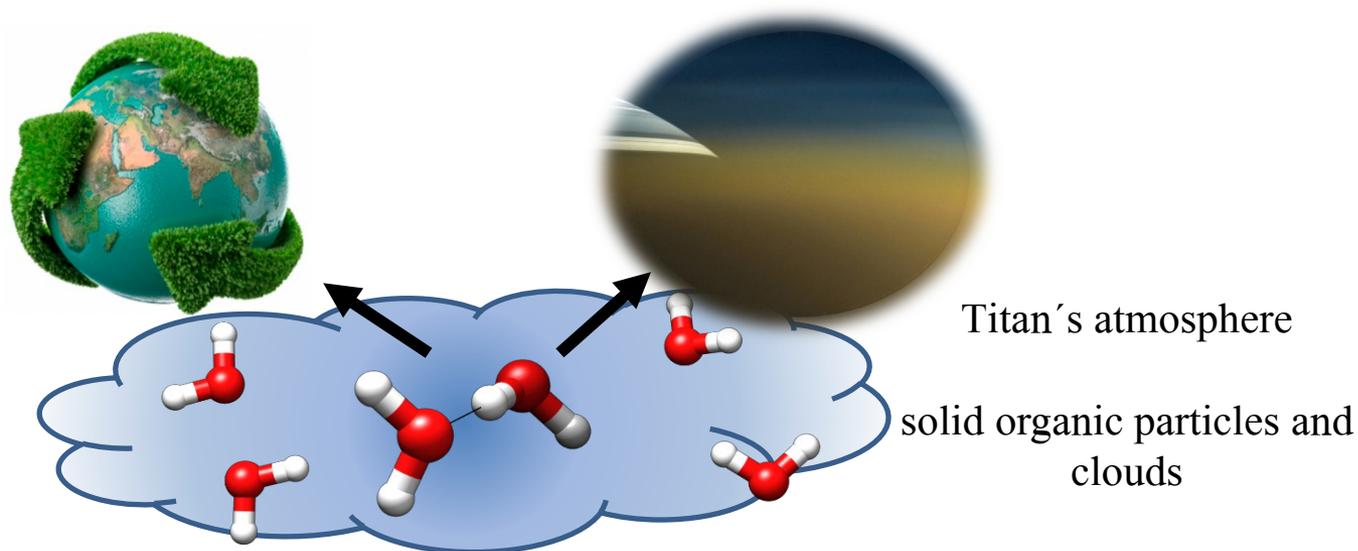
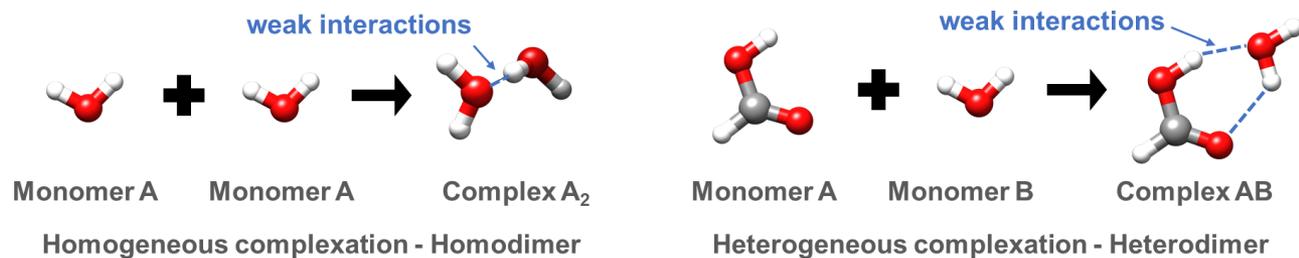
Lindemann mechanism

↻ A-B weak non-covalent interaction → Complexation process



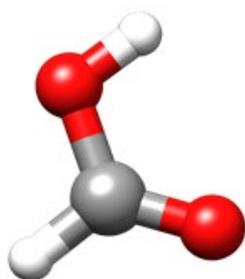

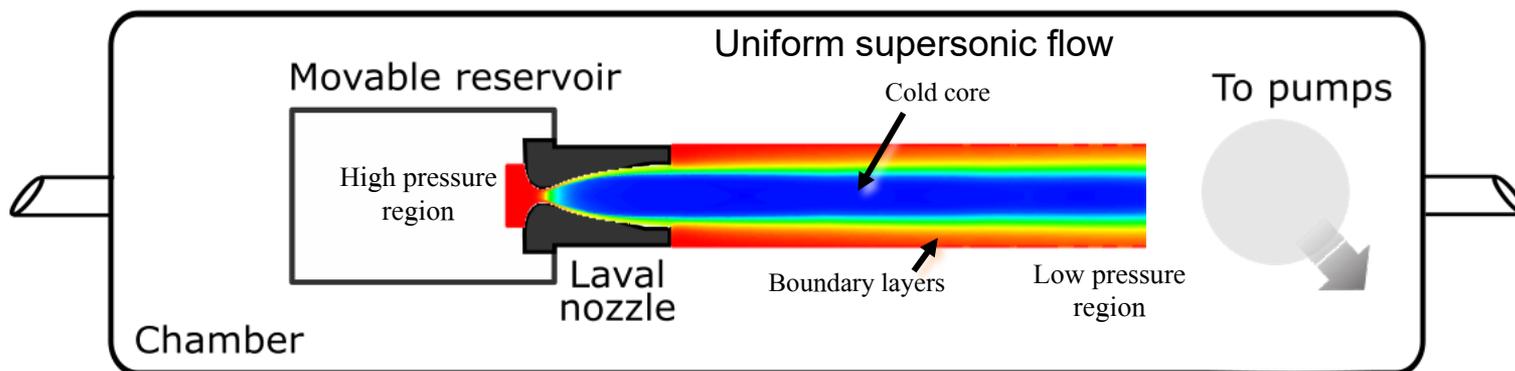

EXPERIMENTAL METHOD

☞ Uniform supersonic Flows → CRESU technique



Convergent-Divergent nozzle to create supersonic flow

$$C_p T_{\text{res}} = C_p T_{\text{flow}} + \frac{v_{\text{flow}}^2}{2}$$

Wall-less cooling reactor

Uniform supersonic flow

Length = 10 – 70 cm $T = 10 - 220 \text{ K}$ $\rho = 10^{16} - 10^{18} \text{ cm}^{-3}$

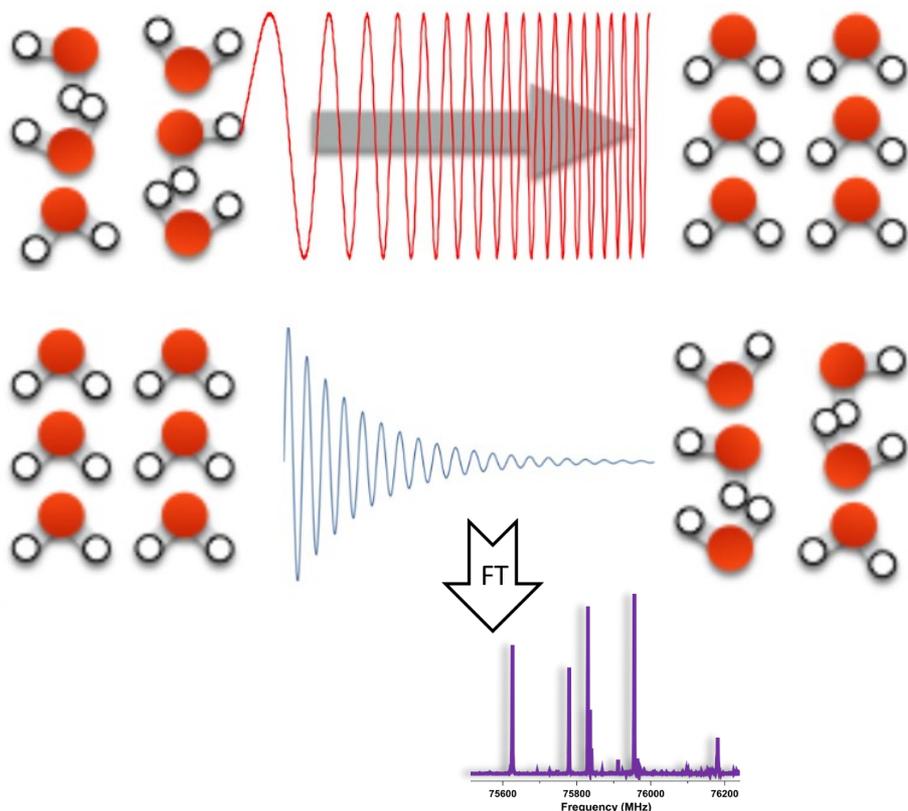
Frequent enough collisions

local thermodynamic equilibrium

a sufficient extent of chemical reaction to take place to follow the kinetics

EXPERIMENTAL METHOD

☞ Chirped-Pulse microwave spectroscopy



High specificity

Distinguish **simultaneously** between different species

Conformers, isomers, vibrational excited states, isotopologues ...

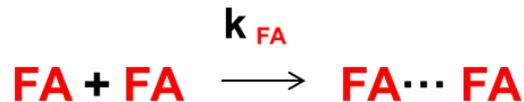
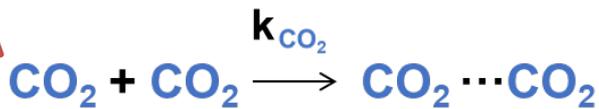


REACTION KINETICS



$$r = k [\text{FA}][\text{CO}_2] \xrightarrow{[\text{CO}_2] \gg [\text{FA}]} r = k' [\text{FA}]$$

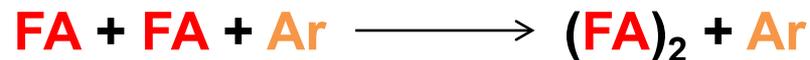

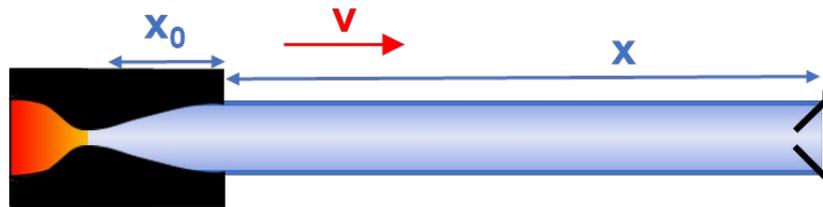
☞ Formic acid homodimer formation → Termolecular reaction



$$-\frac{1}{2} \frac{d[\text{FA}]}{dt} = k [\text{FA}]^2 [\text{Ar}] \xrightarrow{k' = k [\text{Ar}]} \frac{d[\text{FA}]}{dt} = -2k' [\text{FA}]^2$$

$$\frac{1}{[\text{FA}]_t} - \frac{1}{[\text{FA}]_{t_0}} = 2k't \xrightarrow{t = \frac{x + x_0}{v}} \frac{1}{[\text{FA}]_x} - \frac{1}{[\text{FA}]_{x_0}} = \frac{2k'x}{v}$$

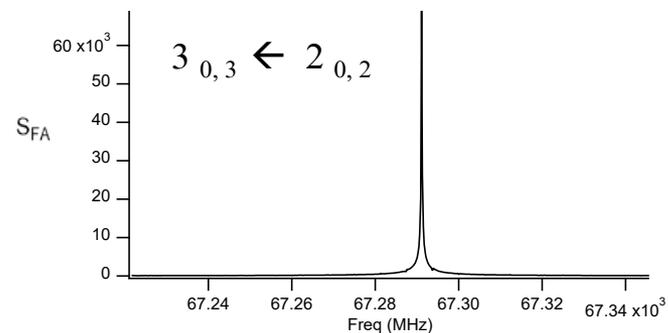
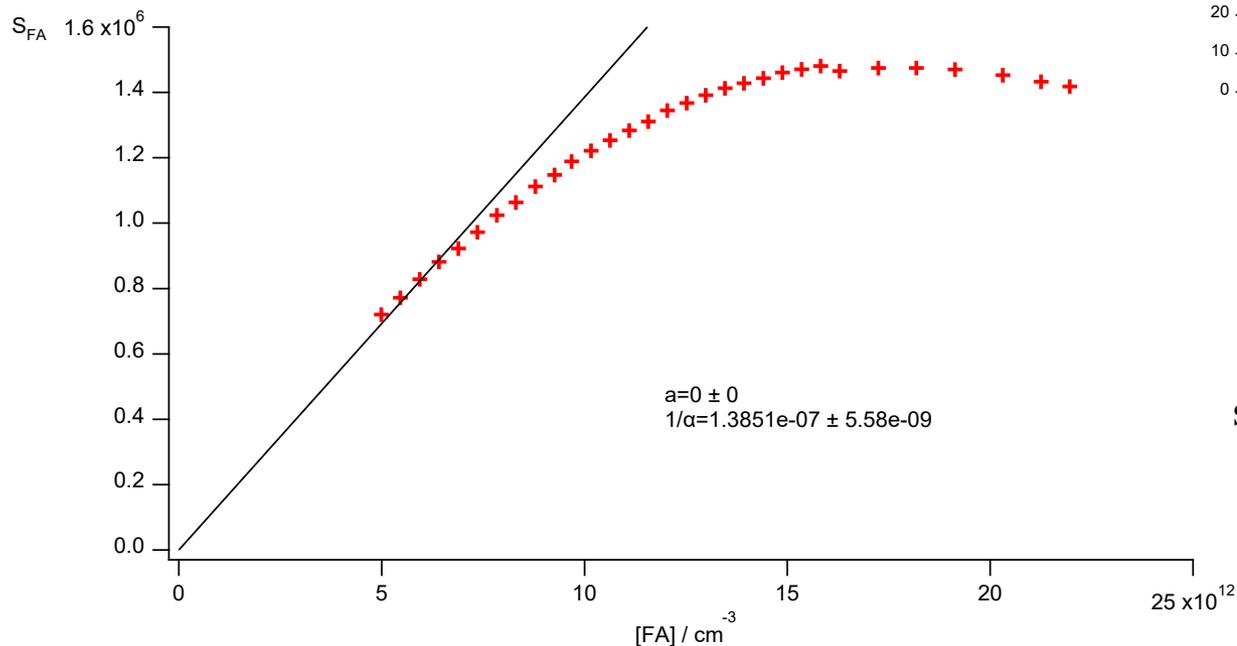
Absolute density value

☞ Determination of apparent rate constant of the formic acid dimer formation

Formic acid + CO₂ formation → Heterodimer formation reaction

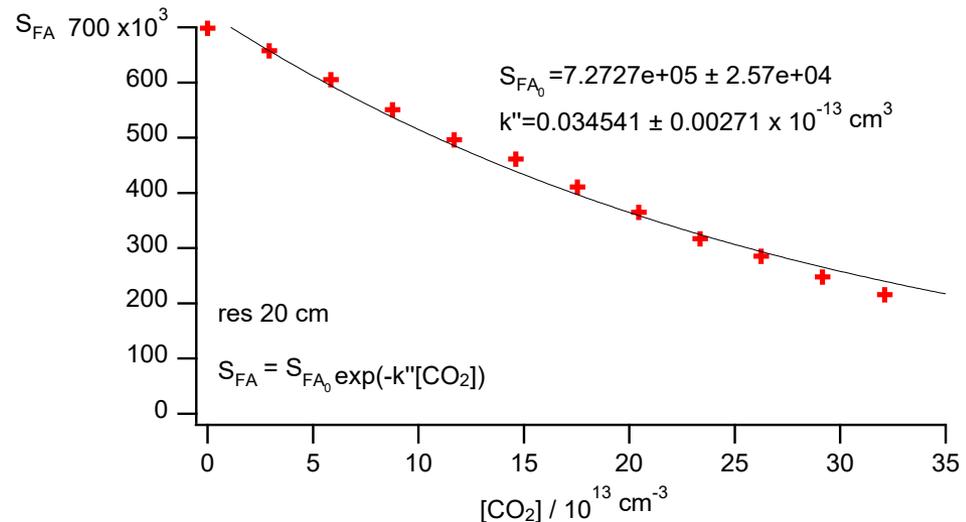


$$-\frac{d[\text{FA}]}{dt} = k'[\text{FA}][\text{CO}_2] \longrightarrow [\text{FA}]_t = [\text{FA}]_{t_0} \exp(-k' t [\text{CO}_2])$$

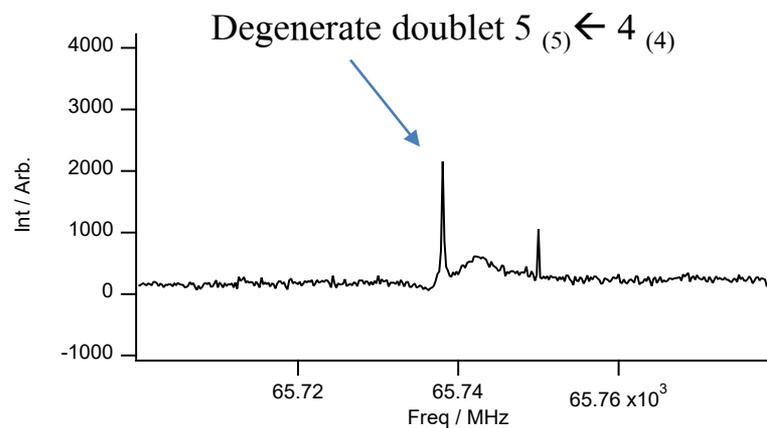
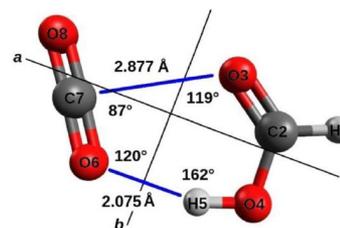
☞ First direct determination of a weakly bound heterodimer formation rate constant
