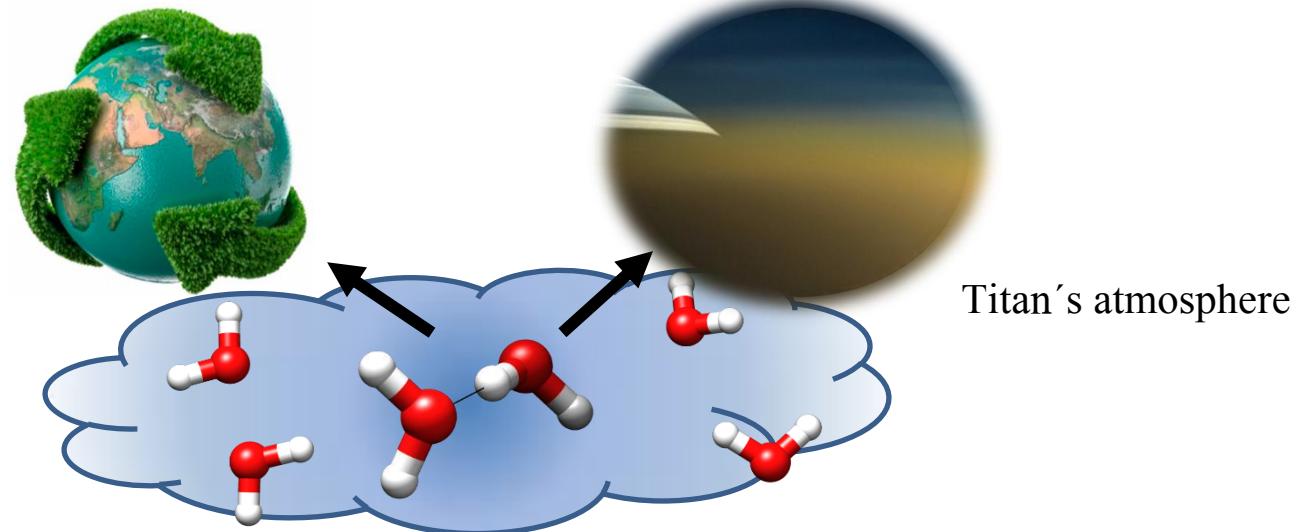
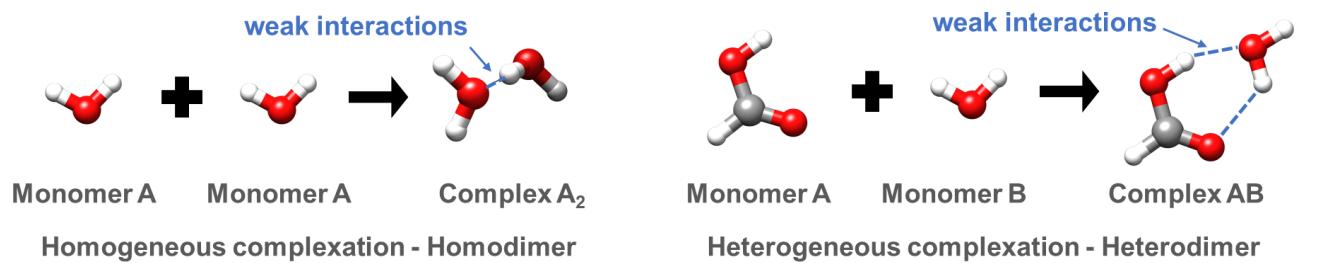
Lindemann mechanism

❖ A-B weak non-covalent interaction → Complexation process



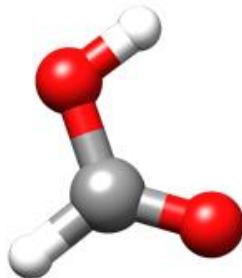

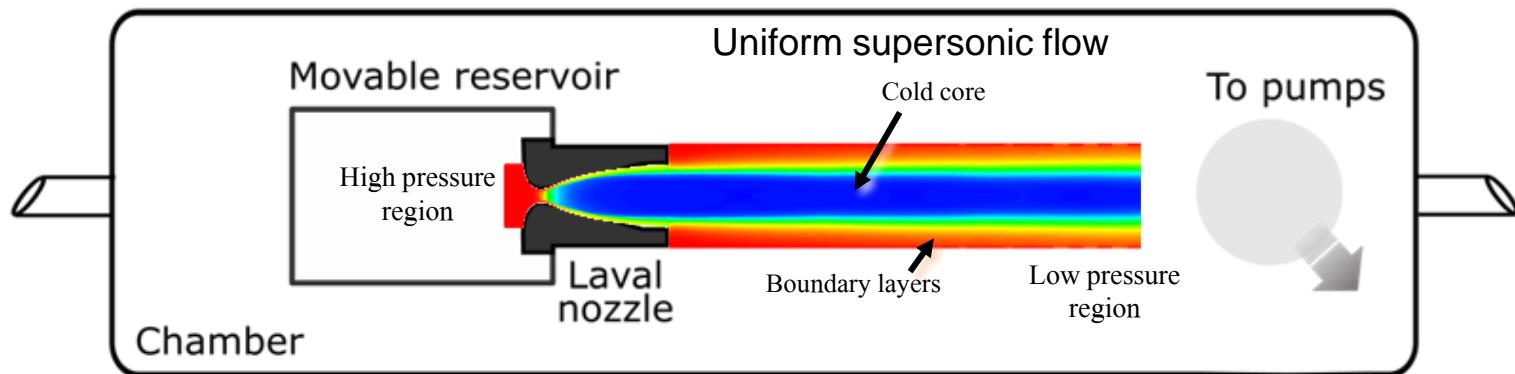

EXPERIMENTAL METHOD

☞ Uniform supersonic Flows → CRESU technique



Convergent-Divergent nozzle to create supersonic flow

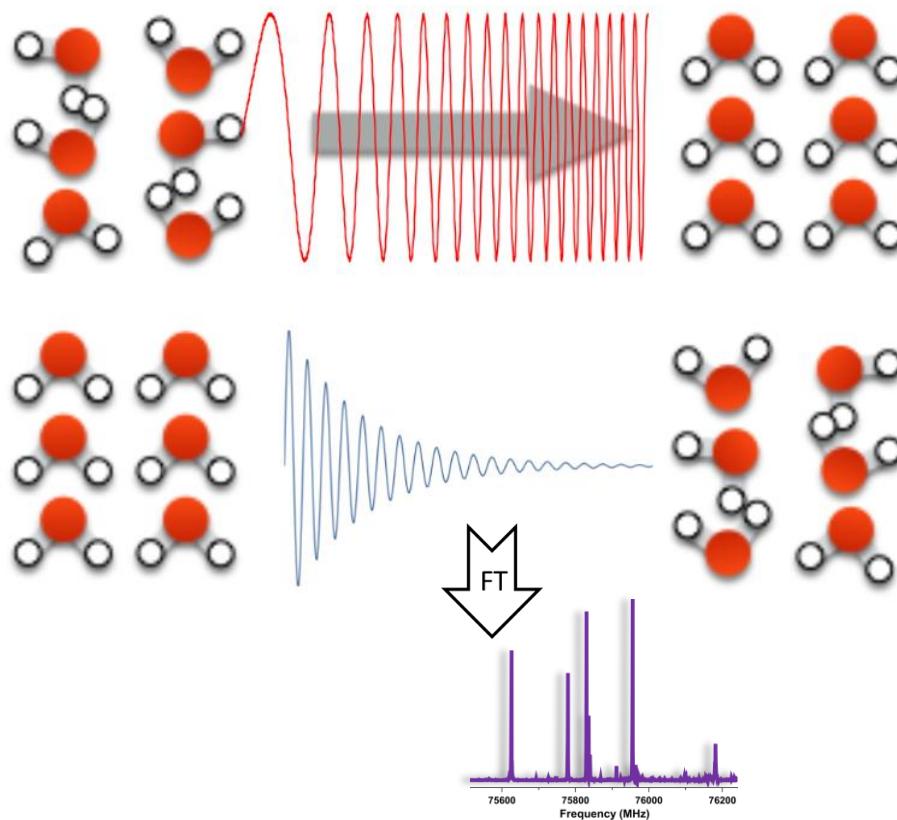
$$C_p T_{\text{res}} = C_p T_{\text{flow}} + \frac{V_{\text{flow}}^2}{2}$$

Wall-less cooling reactor
Uniform supersonic flow

Length = 10 – 70 cm T = 10 – 220 K $\rho = 10^{16} - 10^{18} \text{ cm}^{-3}$

EXPERIMENTAL METHOD

❖ Chirped-Pulse microwave spectroscopy



High specificity

Distinguish simultaneously between different species

Conformers, isomers, vibrational excited states, isotopologues ...

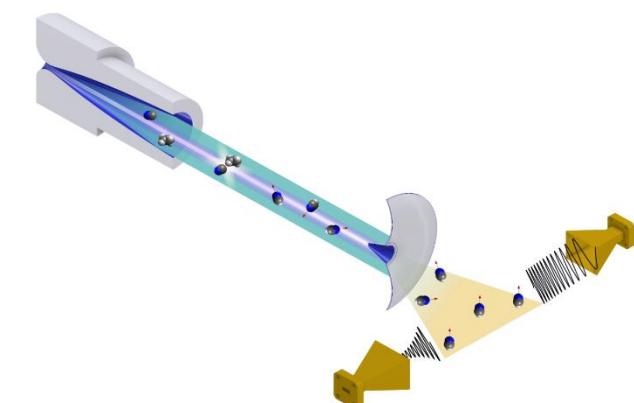

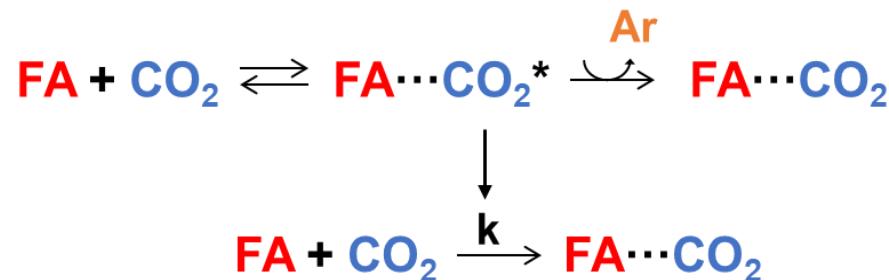
❖ Acquisition procedure → Importance of the skimmer chamber



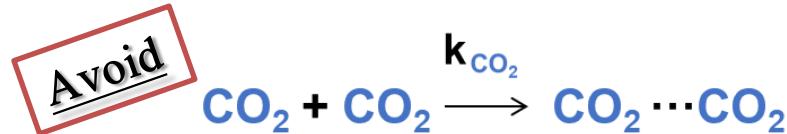
The rapid drop in density following molecular beam sampling into the lower pressure skimmer chamber effectively freeze the reactants

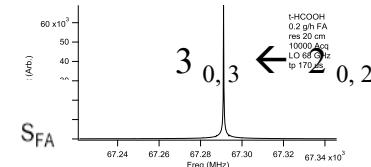
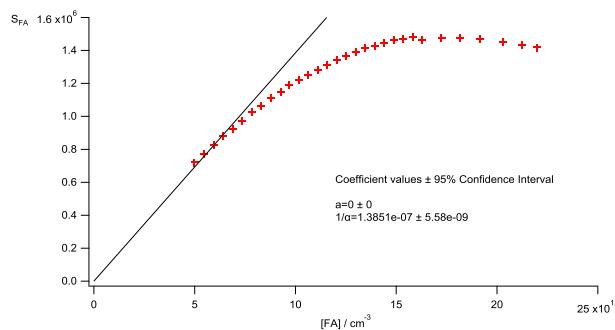
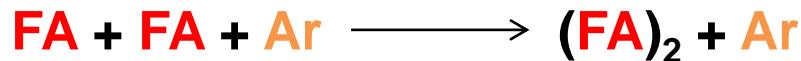

small removal fraction of the monomer (20-30%)

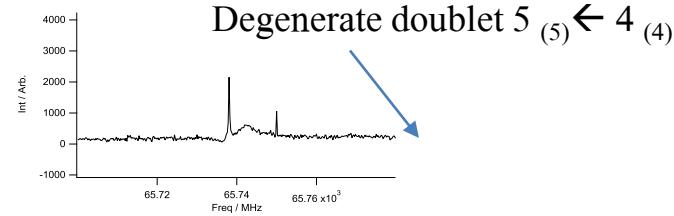
❖ First direct determination of a weakly bound heterodimer formation rate constant

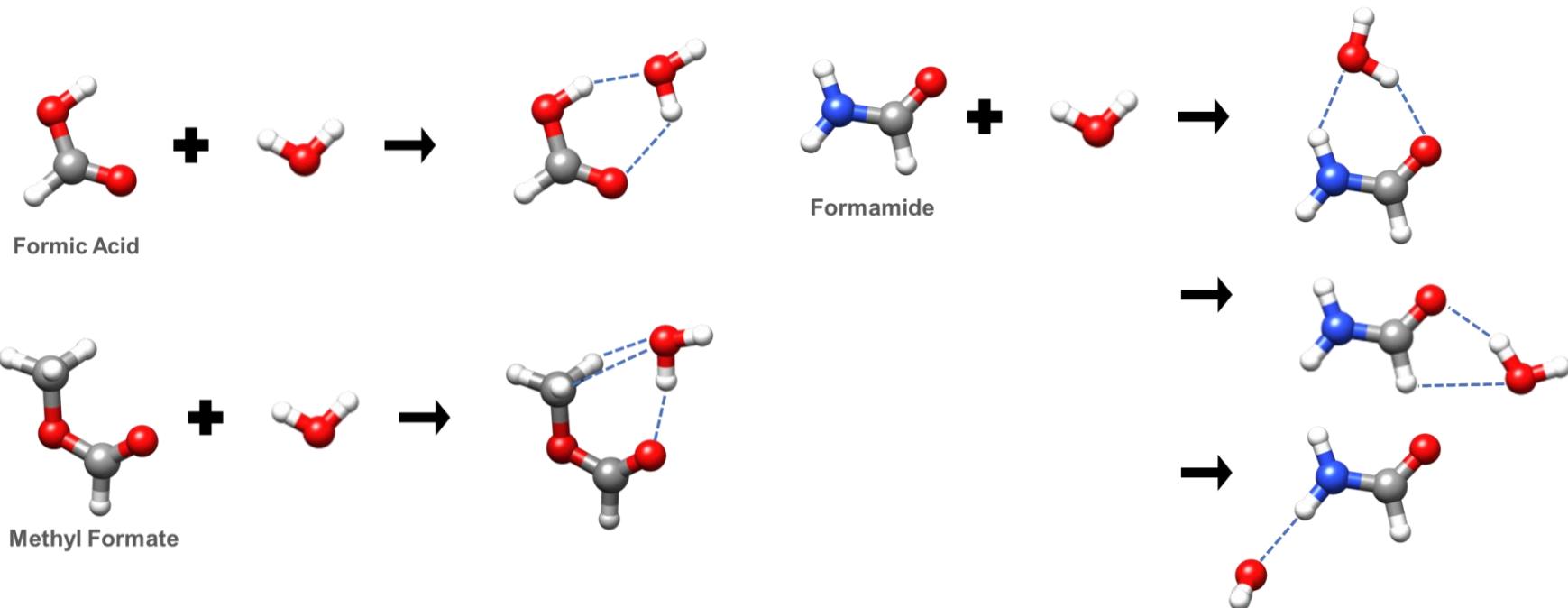
