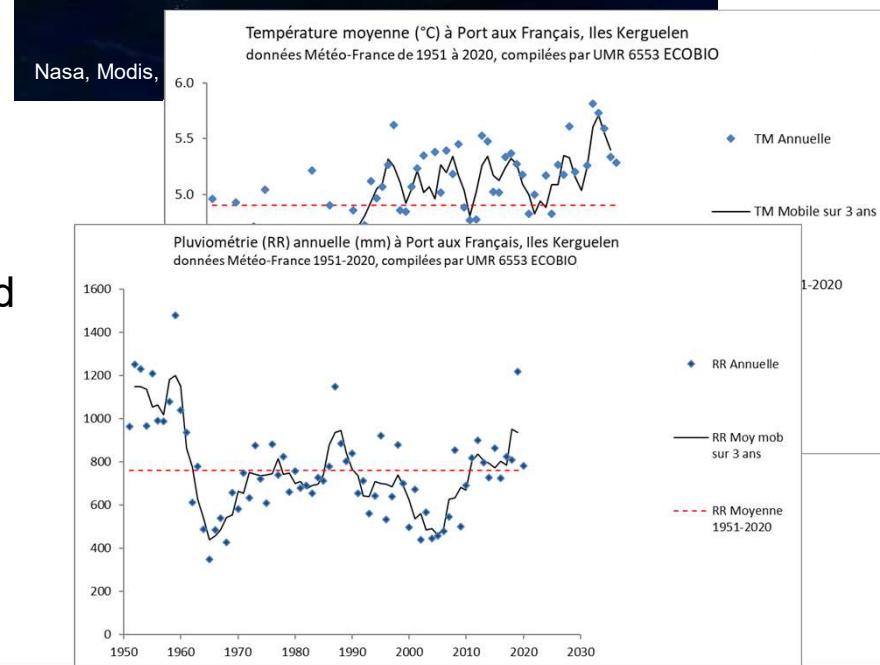

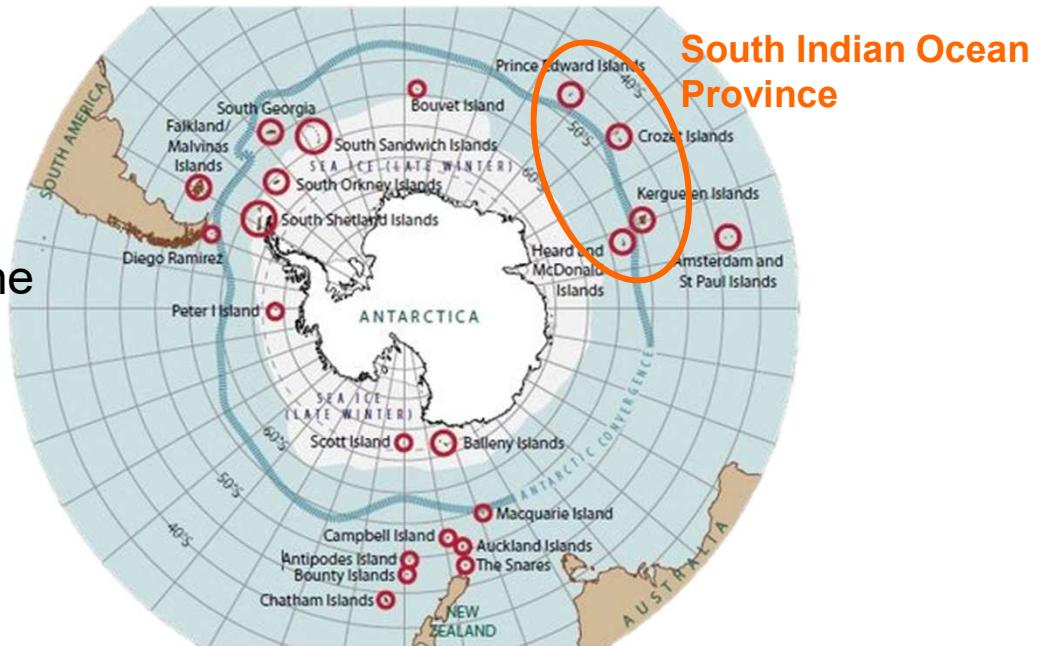
Iles Kerguelen, sentinels of climate change



- Sub-Antarctic region, below the Polar Front
- Cold climate $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ and windy all year round
- Rapid climate warming and drying

Kerguelen biodiversity and ecosystem

- Only 22 native plant species
(e.g. 15000 plant sp. in Europe !)
- BUT 6 endemics (*) of the SIOP
- Keys, long evolutionary history of the southern flora; patrimonial interest



(*) Species restricted to a specified region or locality – UN, 1997

3. Adaptation: heritable change, fitness

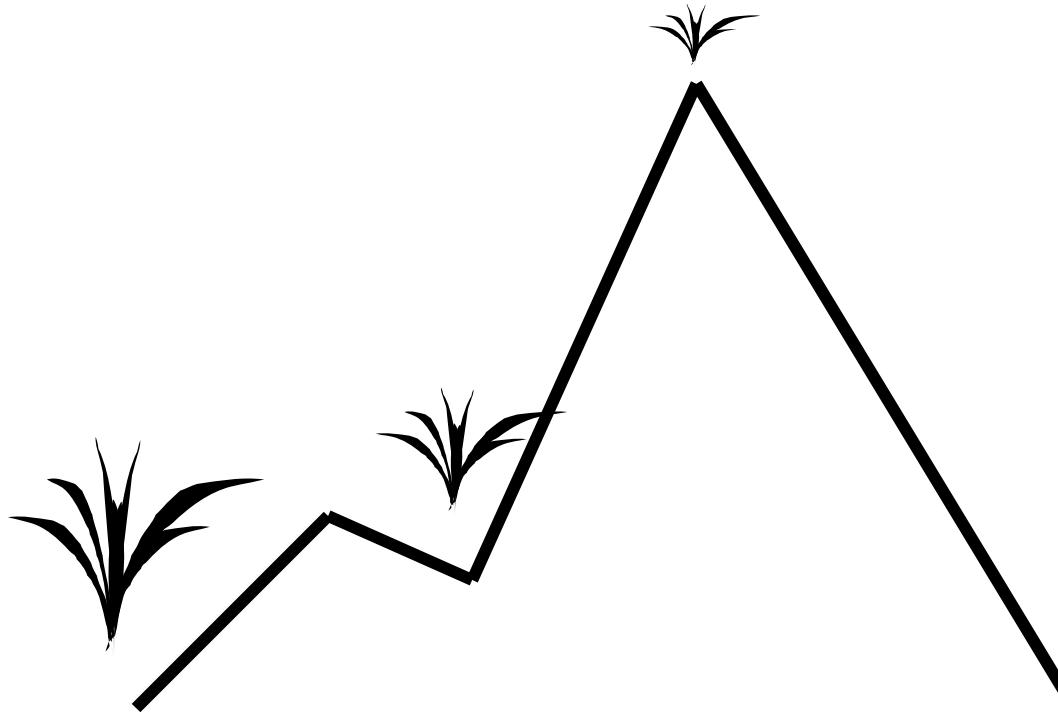


Holobiont : plant with its microbial communities, above- and below-ground

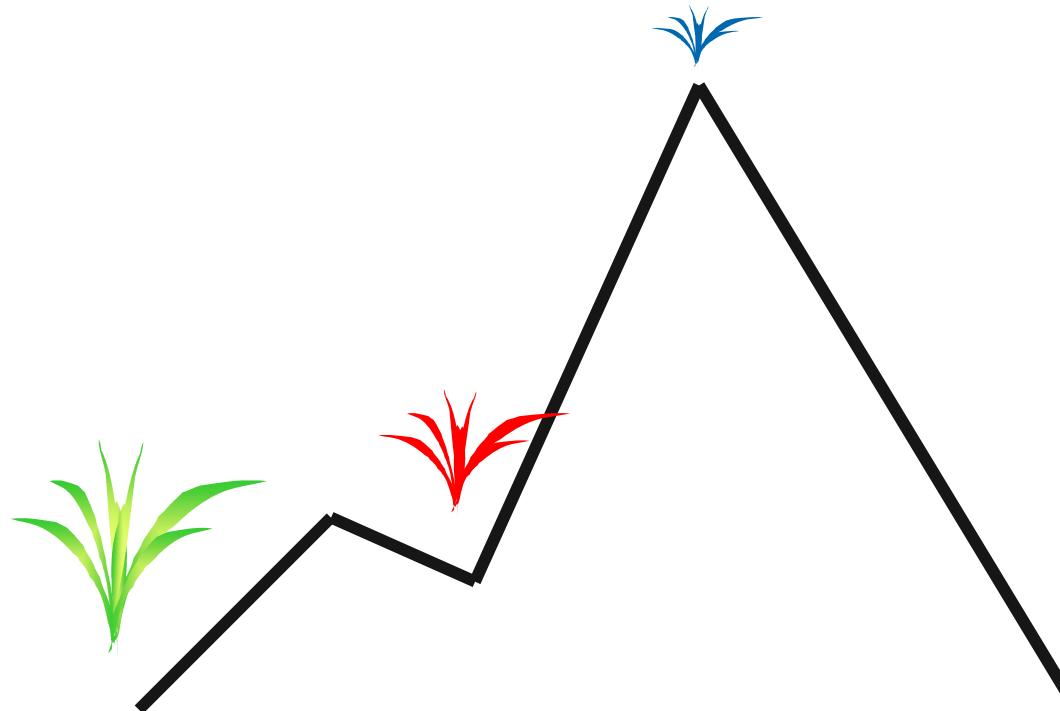

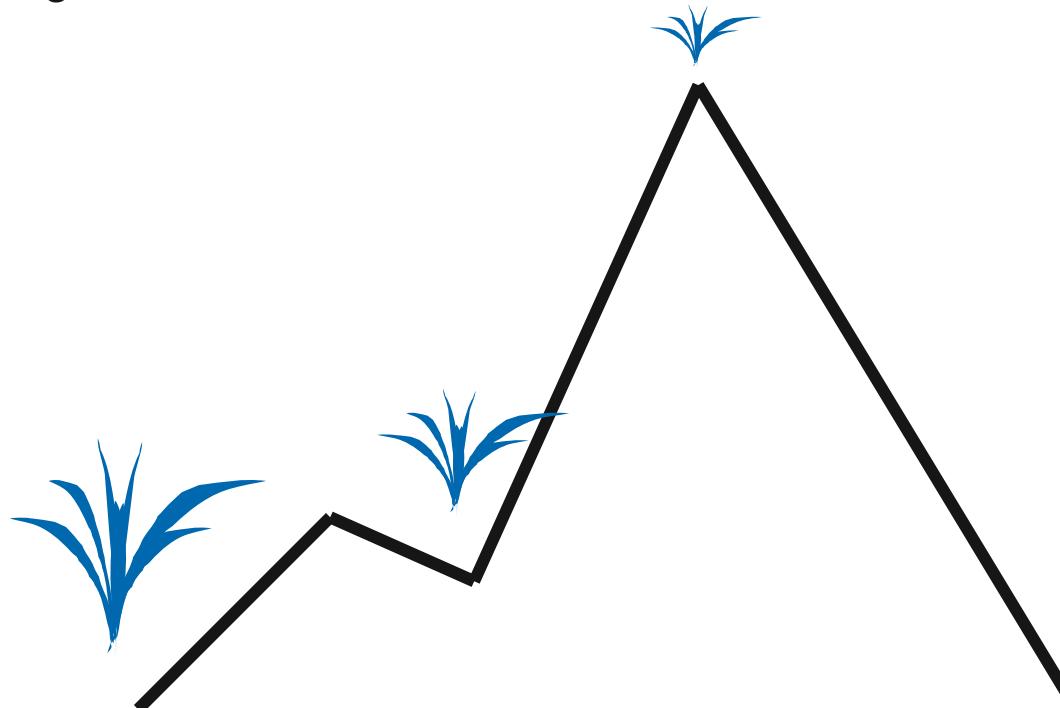
- Genetic adaptation to local conditions: different genotypes depending on conditions

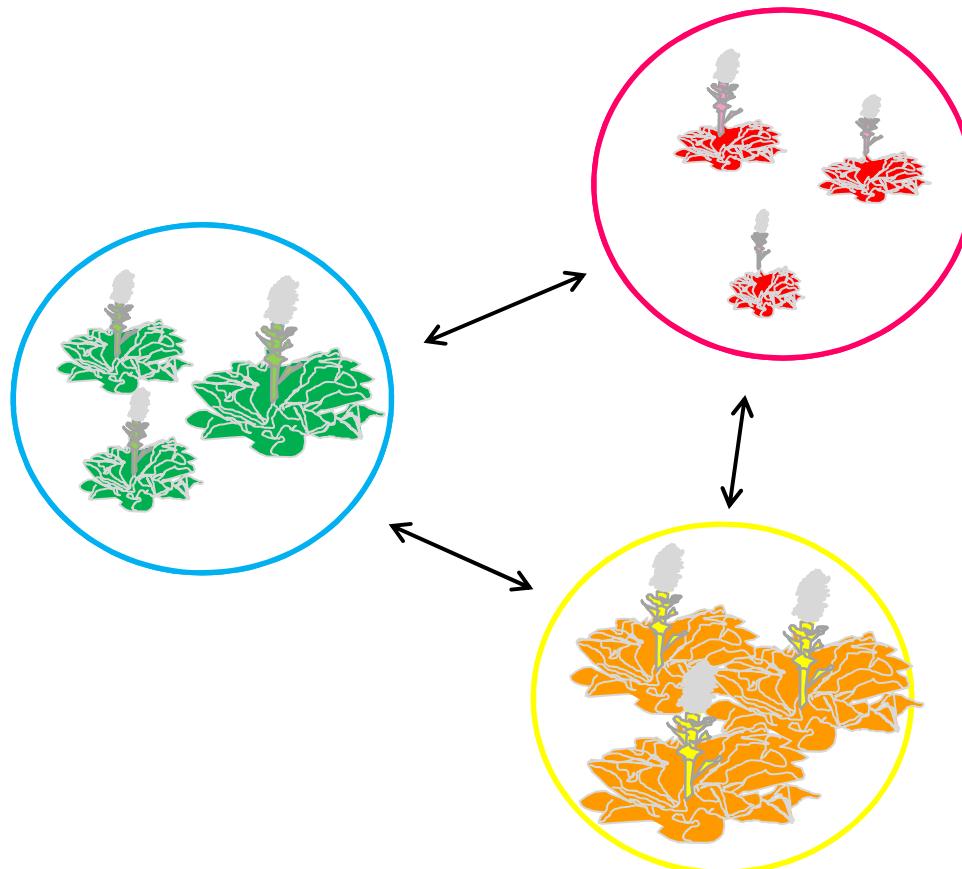
Observation: traits are different depending on the environment

- Phenotypic plasticity: ability of a genotype to express different phenotypes depending on conditions



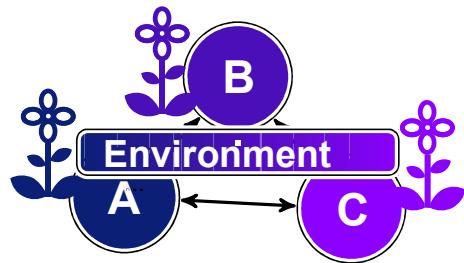

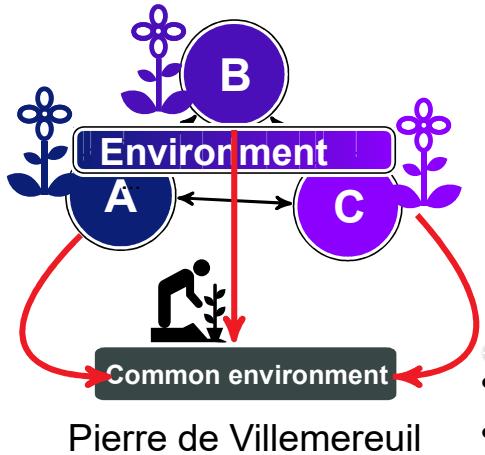

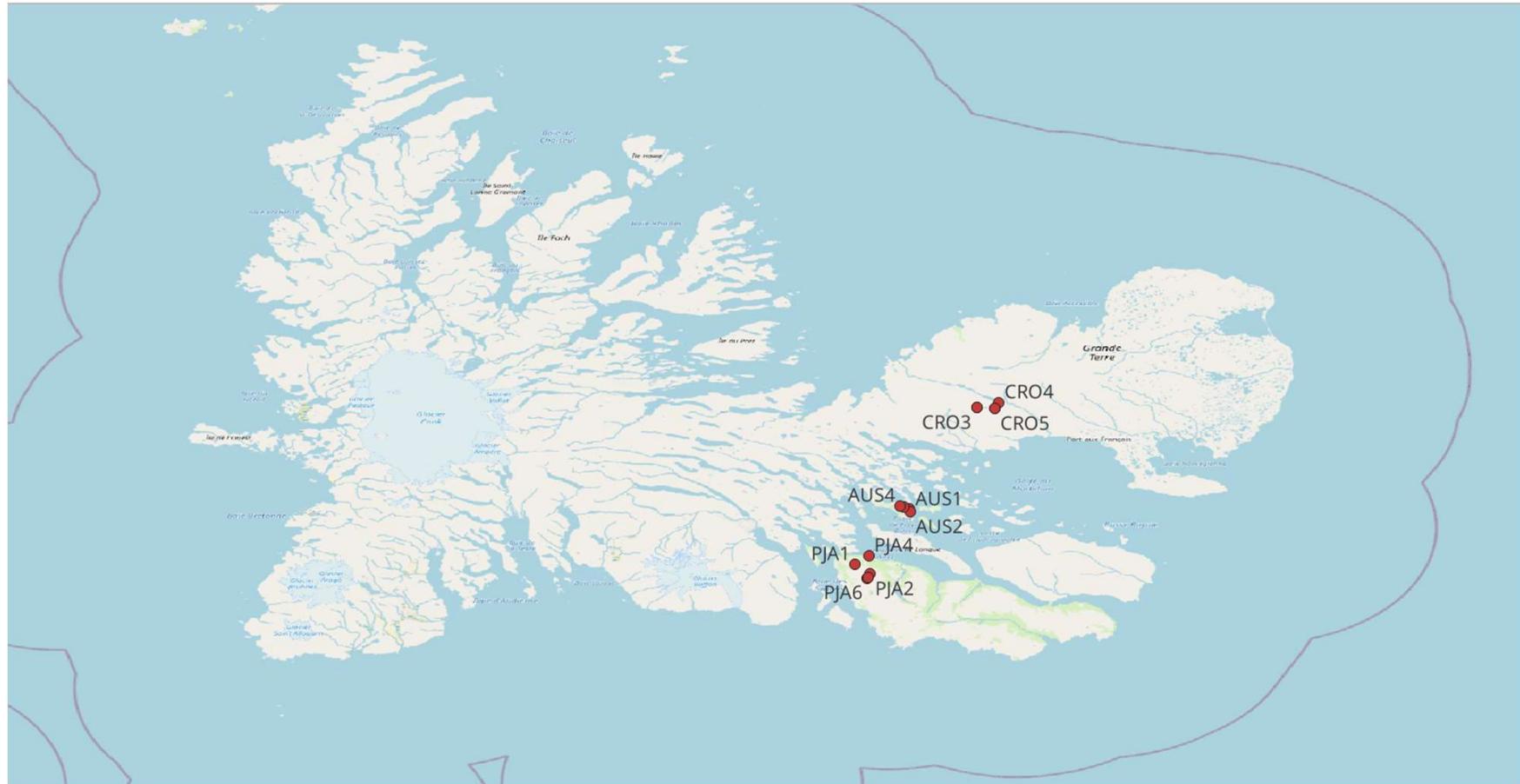

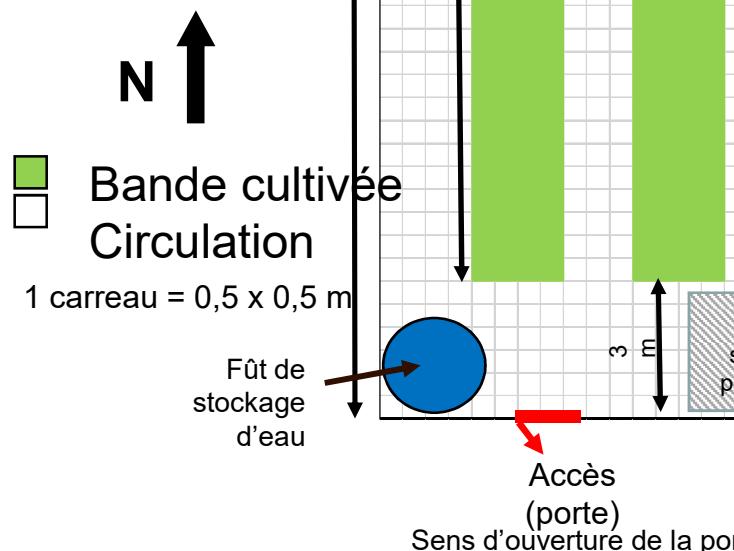

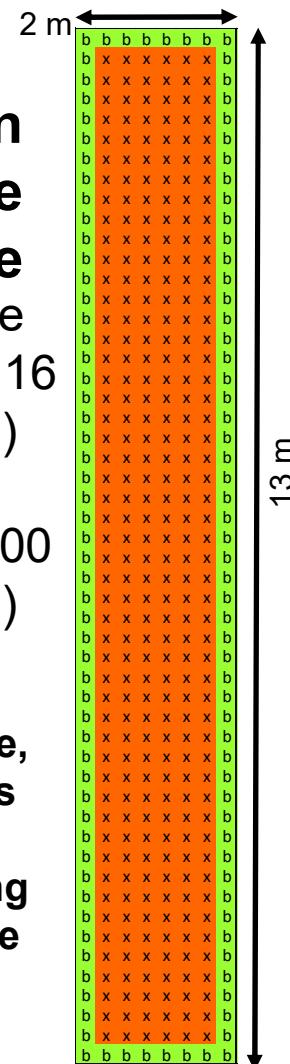
Plan général d'un jardin - Station météo dans le jardin

x : plante étudiée (300 par bande)

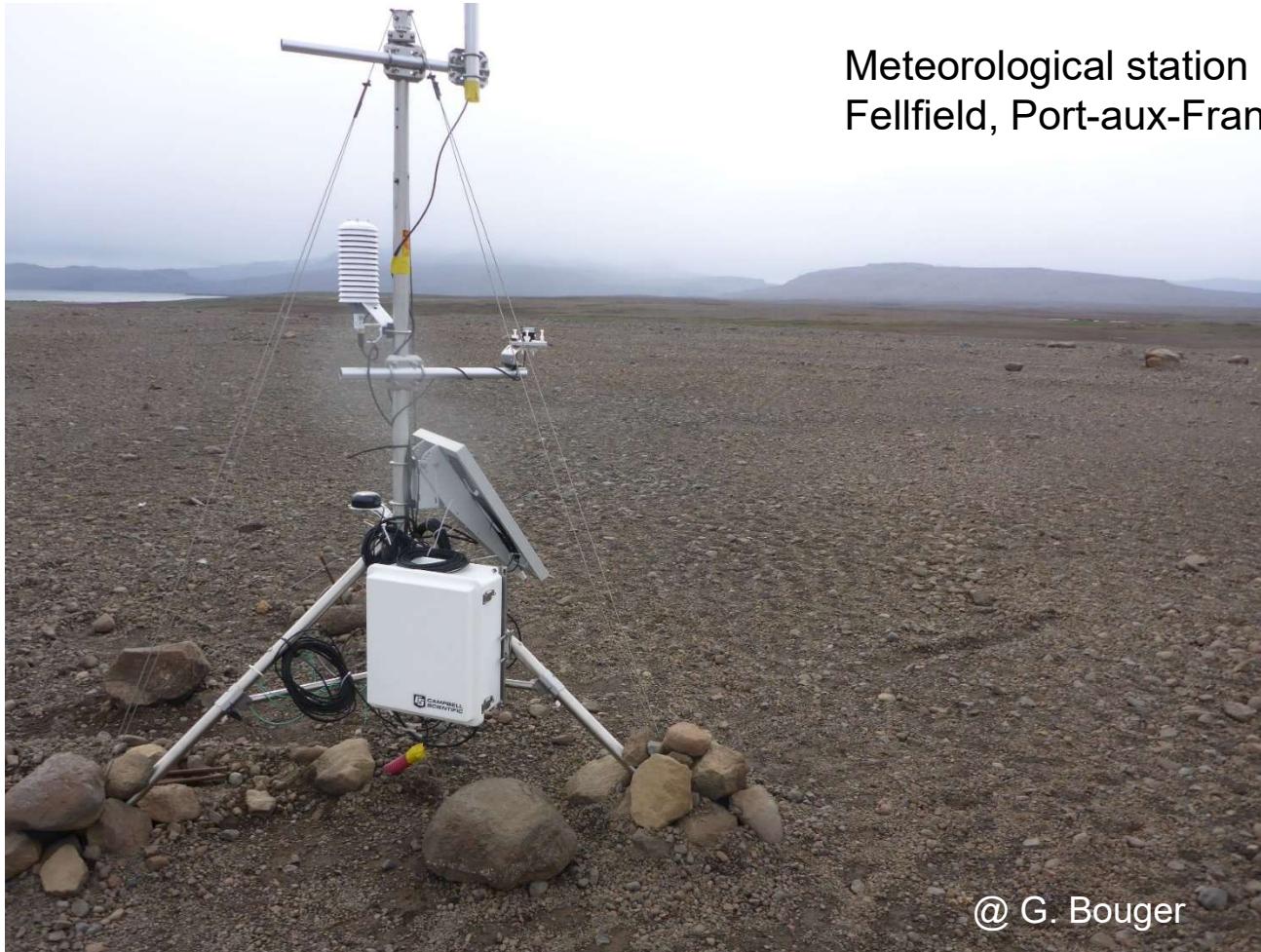
En cas de terrain en pente, orientation des bandes cultivées le long des courbes de niveau
